Re: Consumer Notification for Integrity Bank Plus

Dear :

This letter is to inform you that Microbilt Corporation discovered that your personal information (name, address, Social Security number and/or other information contained in credit and/or other reports) may have been impermissibly accessed by a party without proper authorization. The inquiry would appear on your credit report as Microbilt/Integrity Bank Plus or Integrity Bank Plus.

Upon learning of this potential unauthorized conduct, Microbilt immediately terminated access and a dedicated team was assembled to conduct a thorough investigation into the issue, the results of which, as warranted, may be provided to appropriate law enforcement.

The following information is being provided to help protect you from potential misuse of your information, including the potential of identity theft. It is also recommend that you contact the credit reporting agencies in order to:

- Place an extended fraud alert on your credit file (Microbilt has already contacted the appropriate credit reporting agency and instructed them to place a temporary fraud alert on your file which, will stay on for 90 days). A fraud alert tells creditors to take extra precautions before they open any new accounts or change any existing accounts. After you place an ID Theft Report, an extended alert can be placed by calling a credit bureaus' Automated Fraud Alert system at the numbers below. You only need to contact one of the three credit reporting agencies; your request will be shared electronically with the other two repositories.
- Request a free copy of your credit report and review the credit report for suspicious activity. Credit bureau employees are available to help you interpret your report once you receive a copy of it, if needed. You may obtain your report by contacting any of three credit reporting agencies.
- Check your credit report periodically. If you find suspicious activity on your credit report or have reason to believe your information is being misused, you should call your local law enforcement agency and file a police report. You should get a copy of the police report since many creditors want the information it contains to address the fraudulent debts. You should also then notify Trans Union, Experian, and Equifax as well as file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") at www.consumer.gov/idtheft or at 1-877-ID-THEFT (438-4338). The complaint will be accessible to law enforcement for their investigations.

Finally, MicroBilt is willing to offer you, free of charge for one year, Identity Theft Insurance and Restoration Service through AIG Insurance, up to \$25,000.00. This service would allow you, in the event of identity theft, to obtain up to six credit reports within twelve months of the identity theft event (no more than two from each of the three major consumer credit bureaus), reimbursement for lost wages, long distance phone calls, certified letters, and more.
